## INTERVENTION

**PARENTING AWARENESS AND DRUG-RISK EDUCATION SERVICES (PADRES)** provides parenting education to individuals who are expecting or have a child under the age of six with the intent to decrease the impact of substance use.

## TREATMENT & RECOVERY

### **OUTREACH, SCREENING, ASSESSMENT & REFERRAL (OSAR)**

Provides access to screenings for outpatient and residential treatment for individuals seeking help from the devastating effects of substance use and abuse. Access to state funded detox, residential and/or outpatient services to individuals that have no ability to pay.

Number Screened **2,678**

**ADULT & YOUTH OUTPATIENT TREATMENT** programs provide 3 to 6 months of outpatient or aftercare program for those in need of substance misuse treatment and have met the criteria to receive state funded services.

Number of Adults Placed **397**

Number of Youth Placed **81**

**Adult Criminal Justice Treatment** - programs provide 6 to 9 months of outpatient and aftercare programs for those referred by the legal system of East Texas to obtain recovery from the consequences of their substance abuse and legal problems.

## Number of Adults Placed in Outpatient/Aftercare Treatment 346

**Court Ordered Programs** offers classes for those convicted of first DWI, multiple DWI and/or Drug Offenses. Classes and time vary according to the individual offenses. Classes are offered throughout the Deep East Texas area for the convenience of travel for individuals.
